OBJECTIVE

To appreciate that there are many differences between people.

OUTCOME

To understand that these differences need to be respected.

To understand that despite these differences, people need to be treated equally.

MATERIALS

Paper, coloring materials, painting materials, pencils, erasers, pens.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Introduce the exercise to everyone, and present the objectives and outcomes.
- 2. Ask the students to name as many differences between people as they can and write their responses down. Here are some examples:
- Disability
- Gender
- Race
- Sexuality
- 3. Ask everyone to spend 15 minutes creating a picture or poem (give them a choice) about equality.
- 4. End the exercise by stating to everyone that there are a lot of differences in the world between people, but these differences need to be respected so that all are treated equally.

EVALUATION

 Get a few volunteers to present their creation and ask everyone to discuss what messages the work is giving.
